Old Business: Jessica reported on the City meeting with Amtrak. The City needs to lobby the federal government for a full allocation to Amtrak. Ohio needs to let the federal government know that it is interested in receiving block grants. It would be helpful to have a resolution from Council to state and federal governments. Individuals can also send letters of support to their state/federal representatives/senators for both issues. David will email Stu Nicholson about language for advocacy letters and will also create a presentation for local groups. Carla will work on an electronic petition.

A verbal agreement is in place to propose to Council concerning a property trade; the properties are the Nelson-Morrow building and the Senior Center. The Miami IT building would be used as temporary space for Talawanda SD. A written agreement is forthcoming.

The Locust St. corridor and multi-modal transportation are in the top topics for the Comprehensive Plan. A plan is needed with a cost estimate and a schematic level of design for the City to apply for grants.

New Business: The Transportation Plan needs to be updated. Major corridors and trail alignments need to be determined, multi-modal design standards need to be adopted for different corridor types, and schematic designs and cost estimates need to be completed for major corridors and trail alignments. The Locust St. corridor needs better walkability/multi-modal access, traffic and access management, mixed use and streetscapes, long term planning and feasibility analysis, and a possible grade separation.
